Chapter 9

Limitation of the Study

Nevertheless, a lot of innovations have been the outcome of this empirical study, the following limitations have also been traced which stand as a barrier to explain certain things as should have been

- The number of variables could have been more and the relevancy index of the study should have been indexed through some small scale pilot study.
- 2. The high level of residual effect can be attributed to the high value of CV of certain variables.
- 3. As a concept, energy metabolism in Indian farming is complex and rendered indiscernible to some extent by the respondents, the responses are suffering from fair amount of subjectivity.
- 4. The number of respondents could have been more and high level of variance could have been explained therewith, but time and resources stand as a bale.
- 5. The participatory analysis and delineation could have been a better option to justify the domain of inexplicability in a better and wider way.
- 6. Since, tools of energy calculation and estimation, that to in a natural set up, are not enough available, they are not full proof either.

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
